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I. Overview of Space Overutilization

The Department of Education (DOE) experiences overall enrollment growth every year. In the last five years, total enrollment has grown by close to 45,000 students, and is expected to continue to grow. Although on the aggregate total building capacity is greater than total enrollment, geographic misalignment between building locations and student residences, as well as variations in school quality, lead to highly variable rates of building utilization. As a result, some buildings are significantly underutilized, while others are significantly overutilized.

The DOE uses various strategies to alleviate overcrowding and to address increases in enrollment. These strategies include new construction, rezoning the catchment areas of zoned schools, helping principals program their instructional space more efficiently, repurposing and creating capacity through room conversion projects, and siting new or expanded schools and programs in underutilized facilities.

The goal of this report is to provide an update on the status of school utilization and the strategies the DOE has and will continue to take to alleviate overutilization.

Snapshot of School Utilization in the 2014-2015 School Year

In the 2014-2015 school year, there were 650 overutilized buildings and 757 out of 1,763 schools (43%) that were overutilized, where the enrollment for these schools exceeded their target capacity. See Appendix I for the complete list of overutilized schools and Appendix II for the complete list of overutilized buildings.

Citywide across all schools, there were 38,825 excess seats. However, as illustrated in the table on pages 2-3 and the map in Appendix III, the distribution of excess seats varied across districts and school types. It is important to note that overutilized schools and buildings are not located strictly within overcrowded districts.

Based on recommendations by the Blue Book Working Group, adjustments were made to the 2014-2015 Blue Book capacity formula, which increased the number of cluster, guidance, and teacher rooms allocated to schools. These changes in the formula resulted in a decrease of target capacity for many elementary and middle schools, and a decrease of overall citywide capacity by over 26,000 seats compared to the 2013-2014 Blue Book. Although over 6,100 seats were added through new construction, leases and Capital Task Force (CTF) room conversion projects, a true comparison of overutilized schools cannot be made using the 2014-2015 to 2013-2014 Blue Book reports. Therefore, the 2014-2015 Blue Book and this report will serve as the new baseline for tracking overutilization moving forward.

NOTE: The term buildings refer to the physical building which may house multiple organizations. The term school refers to those individual organizations.

Although, overutilization is spread across all school types it is mainly concentrated in elementary schools; 58% of overutilized schools are elementary schools and 16% are high schools.

Update on Strategies to Reduce Overutilization from the 2013-2014 Report

During the 2013-2014 school year, 640 schools were overutilized. The DOE was able to reduce utilization below 100% in 66 schools and an additional 20 schools saw a decrease in utilization (See Appendix IV for the list of schools). The strategies employed to decrease utilization at these 86 schools included the building of new capacity, re-siting schools from over-utilized space to new and under-utilized space, rezoning, facilities upgrades, and re-programming space to be used more efficiently. Following is a breakdown of the strategies utilized to decrease overutilization in 53 of the 86 schools, between the 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 school years:

- 1 school received new capacity by way of a new addition.
- 1 school moved into new construction.
- 31 schools had been involved in a DOE Panel for Educational Policy (PEP)-approved proposal to change the way space as utilized in the building, including re-sitings, school phase-outs and closures, new schools, and co-locations.
- 8 schools were impacted by an approved rezoning.
- 8 schools received CTF work (classroom conversions) to increase capacity.
- 2 schools moved from DOE space to private space.
- 2 schools closed at the completion of the 2013-2014 school year.

Additionally, 24 new school buildings, leases, and renovations created new capacity in locations near overutilized schools.

The below strategies were implemented for the 2014-2015 school year. See Appendix V for a description of each category.

- **New Construction:** 11 projects, leases and new construction, created 5,062 additional instructional seats. See Appendix VII for a list of New Building Construction.
- **Renovations and Facilities Upgrades:** 15 buildings received CTF room conversion projects, which resulted in 1,236 new instructional seats. See Appendix VIII for a list of CTF projects.
- **Rezoning:** 5 rezonings were implemented, impacting 31 schools. See Appendix VII for a list of rezonings implemented in 2014-2015 as well as rezonings for the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years.
- **Programming:** 66 overutilized high schools across 59 buildings implemented split-session scheduling to use space as efficiently as possible. See Appendix X for a list of all high schools using split-session programming in their building.
- **Re-purposing Seats:**
 - **Re-sitings:** 12 schools were re-sited to underutilized or new buildings.
 - **Grade Reconfigurations:** 5 schools began to undergo a grade truncation and 11 schools began a grade expansion.
 - **New Schools:** 31 new schools were opened in under-utilized space. See Appendix XI for a list proposals for Repurposing Seats.

II. Current Space Standards for New York City Schools

The Enrollment, Capacity, and Utilization Report (the “Blue Book”) remains the citywide standard for assessing capacity within the New York City Department of Education (“DOE”) buildings. The DOE Instructional Footprint (the “Footprint”) is an instructional translation of the information in the Blue Book, and is meant to assist school managers and staff in efficient programming of space. A number of key stakeholders throughout the DOE have been involved in developing these parameters, including the School Construction Authority (“SCA”), Division of Space Management, Division of School Support, and the Division of Teaching and Learning. The Division of Specialized Instruction and Student Support and school principals also play an active role. See Appendix VI for a description of each key group involved in addressing overutilization in schools.

In assessing the capacity for school organizations and buildings, the Blue Book applies a different formula for each grade level, in order to reflect the typical practice of programming for specific grades. For example, students in elementary and K-5 schools tend to study in a single room for most of the day and attend specialty subject classes in designated rooms. Students in middle, secondary, and high schools, however, move from room to room for their scheduled classes. The formulas take into account both a certain level of flexibility and contractual requirements while recognizing other constraints in

programming. The goal is to assess school and building capacity based on reported usage by applying standard assumptions in how spaces can be used.

In 2014, a Blue Book Working Group was formed to make the Blue Book a document that is a more accurate reflection of the current state of our school buildings and more accessible to the general public. The group includes families from district schools and charter schools, principals, advocacy organizations, Community Education Councils, the United Federation of Teachers, and elected officials. Since it was convened, the working group has met regularly and has conducted building visits to better understand how space is being used. Recommendations from this group were immediately in the 2013-2014 Blue Book. Based on recommendations by the Blue Book Working Group, adjustments were made to the 2014-2015 Blue Book and in the Footprint allocations. Specifically, all schools are now allocated additional space for counseling services, and schools serving middle school grades are allocated additional space for a teacher workroom. Further, schools serving elementary grades now receive a minimum allocation of two cluster rooms for specialty instruction. These changes resulted in a decrease of target capacity for many elementary and middle schools, and decreased overall citywide capacity by over 26,000 seats compared to the 2013-2014 Blue Book.

III. Policy Changes and Competing Initiatives

The DOE's commitment to remove Temporary Classroom Units (TCUs) impacts the need for seats and creates an additional sense of urgency in identifying potentially available capacity. Since November 2013, 73 TCUs across 22 sites have been removed, and an additional 3 units across 2 sites are scheduled to be removed during fiscal year 2016 (through June 2016). For fiscal year 2017 (July 2016 to June 2017), 62 units across 22 sites are scheduled for removal. As of the 2013-2014 Blue Book, TCUs are not counted as capacity, and any enrollment in TCUs is now reported as part of the main building's enrollment.

Additionally, recent amendments to the New York State Education Law, §2850-2857, provides certain new and expanding charter schools with access to facilities. The DOE must either provide these charter schools with a space in a DOE building or pay for the charter school's private facility rental costs. These new amendments will also impact the utilization of DOE buildings, if and when DOE space is approved.

Lastly, new initiatives, such as Pre-K for All, increased enrollment across the city, further utilizing schools, especially in areas of high population growth. Strategies to reduce overutilization in schools while the DOE is simultaneously increasing enrollment has been a challenge. Nevertheless, the DOE works closely with the SCA to identify new leases and construction to accommodate growth in pre-kindergarten enrollment.

IV. Looking Ahead

Since the 2014-2015 school year, the DOE has continued to work towards alleviating overutilized schools through a multitude of comprehensive measures, the results of which will be reported on in the 2015-2016 report. These strategies have included:

- **New Construction:** 52 more projects, leases and new construction, have been completed, creating 14,666 additional instructional seats.

- **Renovations and Facilities Upgrades:** 13 buildings received CTF room conversion projects, which resulted in 579 new instructional seats.
- **Rezoning:** 7 rezonings were implemented for the 2015-2016 school year, impacting 20 elementary schools and two middle schools. 3 more rezonings have been approved for the 2016-2017 school year, impacting seven more schools.
- **Re-purposing Seats:**
 - **Re-sitings:** 13 schools have been re-sited to underutilized or new buildings.
 - **Grade Reconfigurations:** 6 schools began to undergo a grade expansion and 1 school began a grade truncation.
 - **New Schools and Programs:** 8 new schools and programs, including District 75, were opened in under-utilized space.
 - **Closures:** 4 schools have been proposed to close at the end of the 2015-2016 school year, 3 of which have been approved.

V. Conclusion

The DOE is committed to ensuring that students in every community have access to high-quality schools and programs. Additionally, the DOE is committed to improving learning conditions by conducting an annual review of space utilization in schools across the city, and employing various strategies to alleviate overcrowding. As New York City's population continues to grow, the DOE will continue to work with communities to identify methods to use existing space in the most efficient manner possible, while meeting the unique educational needs of our students.




Appendix V:

Descriptions of Strategies to Relieve Overutilization

Overview of Strategies to Relieve Overutilization

1. **New Construction** – The School Construction Authority creates new capacity through leasing and the construction of new school facilities annually, including additions.
2. **Facilities Upgrades** –The Office of Space Planning initiates and plans for capital projects to increase capacity with the SCA. During the 2013 and 2014 calendar year, the Office of Space Planning completed room conversion projects which resulted in 1,815 new instructional seats in 23 buildings.
3. **Rezoning** – Since the 2010-2011 school year, 237 schools have been rezoned. These rezonings created 44 new elementary school zones and 10 new middle school zones for new construction or leased spaces, which has helped alleviate overcrowding at nearby schools by shrinking the size of their zones. Schools impacted by rezoning typically experience small decreases in enrollment initially, however the full impact will not be realized until several years after implementation, when smaller incoming cohorts articulate through a school and larger cohorts graduate out. Therefore, the DOE expects to see a greater impact on overutilization as a result of rezonings six years after implementation for elementary schools and three years after implementation for middle schools.
4. **Programming** – Efficient programming and scheduling by principals can mitigate the effects of overutilized buildings, including split session programming for high schools. Split session programming occurs when schools operate on a staggered schedule. This scheduling maximizes the availability of classrooms by programming more periods per day in high school buildings.
5. **Re-purposing Seats** – Annually, the DOE puts forth a number of proposals to the Panel for Educational Policy (PEP) to create efficiencies in the way space is utilized to best meet specific district educational needs. These proposals, which must go through a public review process outlined in Chancellor’s Regulation A-190, may include re-sitings, grade reconfigurations, siting new schools in under-utilized space, and consolidations. (See Appendix IX for a list of proposals approved by the PEP for the 2013-2014 and 2015-2015school years).
 - **Re-sitings** – The relocation of students from one building to another is often employed to maximize use of new and existing capacity to allow for construction to improve facilities, or as a result of losing a lease. It is sometimes used to re-locate a school or program to a more appropriate location or facility.
 - **Grade Reconfigurations** – The expansion or truncation of a school’s grade levels may be used to expand high-quality schools to serve additional grade levels, align grade spans with the district standard in order to maximize access at standard entry points (e.g. expanding a K-4 school to K-5 or truncating a 5-8 school to 6-8) and address under or overutilization of buildings.
 - **Siting New Schools in Under-utilized Buildings** – The DOE identifies buildings with a significant amount of excess space that could accommodate new district or charter schools, D75 or D79 programs, or Pre-K Centers. An annual “Underutilized List” is posted publicly and can be found on the DOE website: <http://schools.nyc.gov/community/planning/changes/default.htm>. By opening new schools in under-utilized space, capacity is added to a district while meeting specific district needs.
 - **Consolidating Co-located Schools** – By consolidating two co-located schools into one organization, spaces that would have been used for redundant administrative or cluster room

purposes may instead be used for additional instructional space, creating more overall capacity in a building to serve students.

- **School Closures:** A school may be proposed for closure based on persistently low enrollment, performance, or demand. Although closing a school is not a primary strategy to address overutilization, by opening a different school option in place of an extremely under-enrolled school, the DOE is able to use space more efficiently.
6. **Changes to Admissions Policy** – In most instances, students apply for and receive offers to pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, 6th grade, and 9th grade through centralized admissions processes. Controlling the number of students who are offered admission, particularly at the middle and high school level, can be used to address overutilization by limiting admission offers. This control mechanism results in enrollment consistent with a school’s or a building’s capacity. This approach must be balanced against other goals, such as maximizing access to and demand for high-quality programs and schools.

Appendix VI:

Key Groups

School Space Working Group – In 2014, Deputy Mayor Richard Buery and Chancellor Carmen Fariña named education leaders and experts from New York City’s district and charter schools, advocacy organizations, foundations, Community Councils, faith-based organizations, and the real estate sector to the School Space Working Group. The group gathered to share their expertise, document values and principles and make recommendations to guide space utilization and planning moving forward.

The group focused its efforts on developing recommendations to improve current and future co-locations. The narrowed scope was an effort to develop a set of meaningful recommendations in the limited time before the beginning of the 2014-15 school year. Blue Book Working Group – As stated above, a group of community stakeholders was convened in 2014 to make improvements to the annual Blue Book report, which more accurately depicted space in school buildings and is more accessible to families and other stakeholders. Recommendations from this group were implemented in the 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 Blue Book reports. These changes included the removal of capacity figures associated with TCUs, dividing the report into two distinct sections (by building and by organization), releasing two separate Blue Book versions (one with target calculations and one with historical calculations), and enhancing the Principals Annual Space Survey (PASS).

Space Management Group – The Office of Space Planning (“OSP”) and the Office of District Planning (“ODP”) work together to assess space and to strategize how to reduce overutilization, while meeting individual district educational needs. The Space Management Group is also responsible for tracking and reporting on the DOE’s efforts to reduce overutilization and overcrowding conditions.

OSP is the Chancellor’s designee in instructional and administrative space allocation. The office manages and supports principals in all space-related matters. Space planners are responsible for monitoring overutilized buildings and school organizations. OSP also works very closely with the Division of School Facilities (DSF) and SCA to re-purpose and renovate space to be used for instructional purposes.

ODP employs the following strategies to address overutilization in DOE facilities: working with the SCA to identify areas of greatest need for new construction and leased space, opening new schools in underutilized buildings, consolidating schools, rezoning to shift enrollment away from overutilized schools towards school in underutilized buildings; opening new schools or re-siting existing schools in temporary incubation space while construction or renovations are being completed; and working with the Office of Student Enrollment (OSE) to cap and overflow students.

School Construction Authority – The DOE and SCA utilize comprehensive demographic assessments to make informed decisions about projected demand and fiscal restraints, in some cases developing alternatives to balance these two factors. The construction of new school buildings and the build out of leased facilities are designed to address the most critical existing and anticipated capacity needs, with priority given to existing overcrowding at the neighborhood or district level. The SCA also publishes the annual Blue Book report.

Division of School Facilities – The Division of School Facilities (“DSF”) provides support to all DOE schools by ensuring all children have a safe, clean, and well-maintained environment that is conducive to learning. DSF supports all divisions and offices with the logistical work required for the re-organizing and re-locating of school organizations. DSF is instrumental in the re-purposing of space and works very closely with both the SCA and OSP on these initiatives.

Superintendents – Working with OSE and ODP, the community superintendents are responsible for submitting proposals for new or changed zoning lines to the Community Education Council for approval.

Office of Student Enrollment – The Office of Student Enrollment (OSE) uses a wide range of enrollment management strategies to address overutilization, such as projections, the administration of centralized admissions processes, and enrolling and registering new/returning students. In particular, OSE has implemented centralized pre-kindergarten and kindergarten admissions, with priority-based matching. OSE is also consulted regarding capping and overflow recommendations as well as recommendations to relocate Gifted & Talented and pre-kindergarten sections in schools that have exceeded capacity. For middle schools, OSE administers district-specific middle school processes that include the use of seat and match targets. For high schools, OSE helps to mitigate overutilization via a centralized citywide admissions process, which helps to align enrollment with available seats. For all grade levels, OSE implements targets after soliciting principal feedback, with the aim of including the perspective of those closest to the enrollment of each school.

(School Year 2014-2015 and 2015-2016)**

Building Completions
